HISTORY (Good & Beautiful) (grades 4-6) – Please see goodandbeautiful.com. Parents will not need to order. Cost will be approximately \$10-12 per student.

APOLOGETICS FOR THE BIBLE: Description to be released soon

WATERCOLOR (grades 7-8) – The course will cover the fundamentals of watercolor techniques and graduate to painting everyday objects and things in nature. Each student will get their own watercolor brushes and water coloring journal with which to use and learn. Cost will be \$14-\$16.00 per student/per semester

SCIENCE (K-3 and 4-6):

This class will be an intro to science class including the scientific method, and other processes scientists use. Students learn about different areas of science, types of scientists and the jobs they do, science tools, science safety, and planning and conducting experiments using the scientific method.

KARATE: (grades 3-12) Cost is \$5.00 per semester

GYM: (K-3) Fun physical activities played in a group atmosphere.

LEGOS:(K-3) Create and build a host of structures ranging from imaginative to more realistic. The goal of the course is to have fun and explore what our minds and hands can do with a bunch of Legos!

CHOIR: Choir (grades 1-6):

This session will focus on singing Christian songs dependent upon concepts taught in God's Word. Along with understanding the lyrics, we will discuss and learn how they can be incorporated into one's life to become a better Christian and youth in today's world. Additionally, fundamental musical concepts will be taught and at times, character-building stories which complement the songs will be shared to provide students with a well-rounded view of the meaning behind the pieces of music.

ECONOMICS (FALL)/PERSONAL FINANCE (SPRING):

Economics will cover inflation, investments, legal tender, wages, recession, federal debt, etc.

Books: Whatever Happened to Penny Candy (7th Edition) and A Bluestocking Guide: Economics 5th Edition (both available through Christianbook)

Personal finance will cover fundamental banking, debt, loans, wide variety of career choices, income, taxes, setting up a budget, etc.

BOARD GAMES:

Grades 4-12

Cost: \$5.00 each student, for potential damage to my games, and supplies for creating games in class

Playing tabletop games is both educational and fun! We will explore many different types of games, including cards, dice, tile laying, dexterity, cooperative, social deduction, puzzle, solo, and party games. New to the class this year, we will discuss the different game mechanics used by board game designers, and the students will use this information to create and teach their own games (in groups, depending on size of the class).

***WRITING WORKSHOP 7-12th grade.**

Each class will begin with a short lesson and then the rest of the time will be for students to write. Their writing can be creative or used for a long term writing assignment from another class at home. My desire is for students to be comfortable with the writing process- brainstorm, draft, revise, edit and publish. The 5th and 10th class in each session will be a sharing session where the students will share with the class or a small group of students what they have been working on during the previous month. In order for the writing process to be experienced fully, students will need to do some writing at home. If you have a particular situation, class or idea for your student's writing, I am willing to discuss this with you. Materials needed will be a notebook, dictionary, note-cards and pencils.

DETECTIVE SCIENCE (Grades 4-6)

From dusting for fingerprints to analyzing handwriting we'll take a first hand look at how detectives and forensic scientists use science to solve real-life crimes. We will build our observation and critical thinking skills to start thinking like a detective and performing experiments like a real forensic scientist!

Books Used: Detective Science by Jim Wiese, Mind Benders & other puzzles from the Critical Thinking Co.

No books need purchased for class.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP (Grades 7-12)

Students will work in teams to create, develop and launch a product. Students will learn the steps to creating business plan. build self-confidence, analytical and problem-solving skills. They will exercise their independence, drive, determination to succeed, and commitment to seeing projects to completion, or market launch

JOURNALISM:

Grades 9-12

Cost: \$10.00 each student

Journalism class will introduce students to what it takes to be a journalist. In the Spring the students will create their own newspaper.

Completion of this class could either be counted as a Journalism high school elective, or as a part of an English credit since there will be a lot of writing and editing involved. There will be homework required. Please have the books on the first day of Enrichment Day. The book will serve as a text and workbook, and there will be other added activities both in and out of our class time.
